How to Request an IRS Verification Non-filing Letter

If your parent(s) did not file for taxes in 2022, they will need to submit an IRS Verification of Non-filing Letter. If they are unable to obtain an IRS Verification of Non-filing Letter by following one of the options below, please contact the Financial Aid Office at (559)325-5239.

Complete ONE of the following:

Online Request- Get Transcript Online www.irs.gov

- 1. From IRS home page, click "Get Your Tax Record."
- 2. Click "Get Transcript Online."
- 3. Create an ID.me account.
 - a. You will need a government issued photo ID, an email address, and Social Security Number.
- 4. Select "View Tax Records."
- 5. Then "Get Transcript" for 2022.

Phone Request- Get Non-Filing Letter by Mail

- 1. Call the IRS at 1-800-908-9946.
- 2. Follow the prompts to enter the social security number and the numbers in your street address.
- 3. Select "Option 2" to request an IRS Verification of Non-filing Letter and then enter "2022."
- 4. If successfully validated, the letter should be received by mail within 5-10 days from the time of the request.

Online Request- Get Non-filing Letter by Mail

- From www.IRS.gov, click "Get Your Tax Record."
- 2. Click "Get Transcript by Mail."
- 3. Enter the non-filer's Social Security Number, date of birth, street address, and zip or postal code. Use the address currently on file with the IRS.
- 4. Click "Continue", then select "Verification of Non-filing Letter" and in the Tax Year field, select "2022."
- 5. You can expect to receive a paper IRS Verification of Non-filing Letter at the address included within 5 to 10 days.

Special Tax Situations

Amended Tax Return

Bring copy of Tax Return Transcript and a copy of the 1040X (Amended Tax Return), signed by taxpayer and stamped by IRS.

Victim of IRS Tax-Related Identity Theft

- 1. Contact the IRS Identity Theft Protection Specialized Unit (IPSU) via telephone at (800) 908-4490.
- 2. After the IPSU authenticates the tax filer's identity, the tax filer must request the IRS to mail a Transcript Database View (TRDBV).
- 3. Submit a signed statement by the tax filer indicating that he or she was a victim of IRS tax-related identity theft.
